Beyond the Pleasure Principle is a 1920 essay by Sigmund Freud that marks a major turning point in his theoretical approach. Previously, Freud attributed most human behavior to the sexual instinct. With this essay, Freud went "beyond" the simple pleasure principle, developing his drive theory with the addition of the death drive, Todestrieb.

Freud believed that people typically channel their death instincts outwards. 2 Aggression, for example, arises from the death instincts.

In 1920, he published Beyond the Pleasure Principle, which suggested that human existence is a struggle between Eros, or the sex drive, and an instinct toward death. In 1923, Freud was diagnosed with mouth cancer, a consequence of his life-long habit of cigar smoking.
